Preventing Family Violence

Child Sexual Abuse Prevention My Body Belongs to Me

The "My Body Belongs to Me" program is a personal safety and child abuse prevention program for preschool and elementary school aged children and their families. The program educates and empowers children in a non-threatening way so that they may be better equipped to avoid abuse. It is a 3-part program which reaches out to teachers, parents and children.



Teen Dating Violence Prevention

The Teen Dating Violence Prevention Program provides school-based prevention programming to high school students throughout Ventura County. The program includes three, one hour presentations which are provided over the course of one semester. Presentation topics include discussions the various forms of dating violence, including emotional, verbal, digital, and physical abuse, and encourages teens to develop healthy communication skills and relationships.

Supporting Victims

Family Violence Response Team

Advocates staff the hotline 24/7 and can provide: crisis counseling, safety planning, referrals, restraining order assistance and in-person advocate response for victims of domestic violence. HOTLINE: 1-800-636-6738

Support Groups

Free, safe and supportive ongoing groups for women who have been impacted by domestic violence.

Safe Haven Emergency Shelter

30-day emergency shelter for victims who are fleeing domestic violence. Clients who enter our shelter receive case management, counseling, restraining order assistance, advocacy and supportive services.



Safe Journey Transitional Shelter

Transitional, supportive living for victims of domestic violence who have completed a stay in an emergency shelter. Clients receive case management and counseling services which aim to assist them in the healing process and encourage growth, independence, and self-sufficiency.

Encouraging Accountability

Batterers' Intervention Program

A 52-session, court-mandated group program which focuses on fostering the development of participants' nonviolent behavior. The program promotes batterer accountability and the prevention of domestic violence.

Anger Management

A 15-session group program where individuals learn conflict-resolution and communication skills which will help them to more effectively manage their anger.

Co-Custody Parenting

A 10-session group program to promote cooperation, understanding and a reduction of anger and conflict in joint custody and co-parenting situations.

Parenting Education

A 10-session group program that helps parents learn effective ways to support, discipline, encourage and communicate with their children. The class is appropriate for parents with children of all ages.
